

Our Confirmation Process

- 1. Family Faith Conversations
- 2. Baptism Family Discipleship Plan
- 3. Discipleship Training
 - a. Family devotions, weekly worship, discipleship hour, early childhood program, elementary and middle school programs, youth groups and events, summer camps, servant events, personal Bible reading
 - b. Formal and informal training
- 4. Family Faith Conversations leading up to confirmation
 - a. Youth acknowledges to parents a desire to confirm faith
 - b. Age prerequisite: 12 and up
- 5. Pastoral Meeting
 - a. Parents, youth, and pastor meet to review our process of confirmation
 - b. Youth schedules a date to take the knowledge exam
- 6. Knowledge Exam
 - a. $2-2\frac{1}{2}$ hour exam taken in the church office
 - b. Old Testament/New Testament Bible Stories
 - c. The Small Catechism
 - Lord's Prayer
 - Ten Commandments
 - Baptism
 - Lord's Supper
 - Apostle's Creed
 - Confession/Absolution & the Office of the Keys
- 7. Pastoral Interviews with youth & parents 1 hour meetings
 - a. First Meeting Review Bible story portion of exam
 - b. Second Meeting Review catechetical portion of exam
 - c. Third Meeting Review relationship covenant & confirmation liturgy
 - d. Subsequent Meetings As often as needed for youth, parents, and pastor to verify that the youth is ready to confirm his/her faith in light of knowledge, attitudes, and behaviors.

8. Promises of Grace

- a. Participate in ten week discipleship class on Sundays or Wednesdays
- b. Parents and youth participate together with other youth and adults

9. Confirmation Orientation

- a. Participate in two-hour orientation regarding St. John's and the day of confirmation
- b. A designated Saturday morning following the completion of Promises of Grace

10. Confirmation Day

- a. Confirm faith in the worship service most frequently attending
- b. "Yes, with the help of God"

11. Life of Discipleship

- a. Ongoing worship
- b. Ongoing reception of the Lord's Supper
- c. Ongoing Bible study and devotional life
- d. Ongoing service

Note: conversations regarding the reception of the Lord's Supper may begin at any point on or after step 3.
