### Prayer/Discipleship Stories/Opening Conversation

- How have you changed over the years?
- Are these changes physical, emotional, spiritual... all of them?

### Read 2 Kings 2:1-12a

- Who were Elijah and Elisha? What do you know about them?
- What was their relationship?
- What happened to Elijah... Elisha?
- Isn't it interesting where this all took place? Why?

### Another OT Perspective:

- Who did Moses meet with? [Read Ex. 33:7-11](#) / What would the Holy God be to you if it weren't for Jesus? ([Ex. 34](#))

### Read Mark 9:2-13

- Talk about the... What? When? Where? Why? Who?
- Is this encouraging to you now (who is Jesus talking with)?
- What is the reaction of these fishermen? What does God say?
- Jesus changes... how is Jesus revealed in a new way?
- What does the presence of Jesus "do" for the disciples?
- How is Jesus like a BRIDGE in this event?

### Read 2 Corinthians 3:12-18, 4:1-6 & Romans 12:1-2

- Connect this all together... what do we take away from all this today in our everyday lives.
- Is the Transfiguration event still important to our walk in faith?
- Who still speaks? How? Do the Words scare or comfort?
- Then who is transfigured now? Who isn't?
- What about Christ's covenant promise for us... baptismal promise... what's coming for you on the Last Day?

## "Transfiguration"

- a change in form or appearance: *METAMORPHOSIS*
- an exalting, glorifying, or spiritual change

+++++

**metamorphoó: to transform/transfigure**

**Original Word:** μετεμορφώθη (verb)

**Transliteration:** metamorphoó

**Phonetic:** (met-am-or-fo'-o)

*metamorphóō (metá - "change after being with"*

*morphóō - "changing form in keeping with inner reality"*

*transformed after being with; transfigure*
